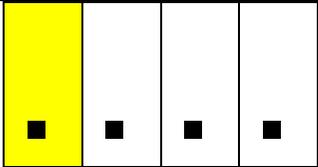
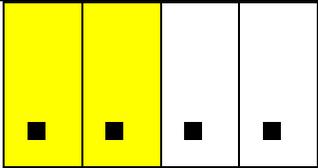


FINDING UNITS AND NON-UNIT FRACTIONS OF AN AMOUNT

Use fraction grids, dots and counters to answer these questions. The first one has been done for you. If you don't have enough room, draw your fraction grid on a whiteboard and record your work in a sketch on the sheet. Check your answer on your calculator using the fraction key.

Question	Fraction Grid	Answer	Equation	Explain Your Reasoning
$\frac{1}{4}$ of 4		1	$4 \div 4 = 1$	Finding a quarter of something is the same as dividing by four. So I am dividing four by four. The answer is one, so one-quarter of four is one.
$\frac{2}{4}$ of 4		2	$4 \div 4 = 1$ $2 \times 1 = 2$	I already know that one-quarter of four is one. I need two-quarters of four, so I need two lots of one or 2×1 .
